

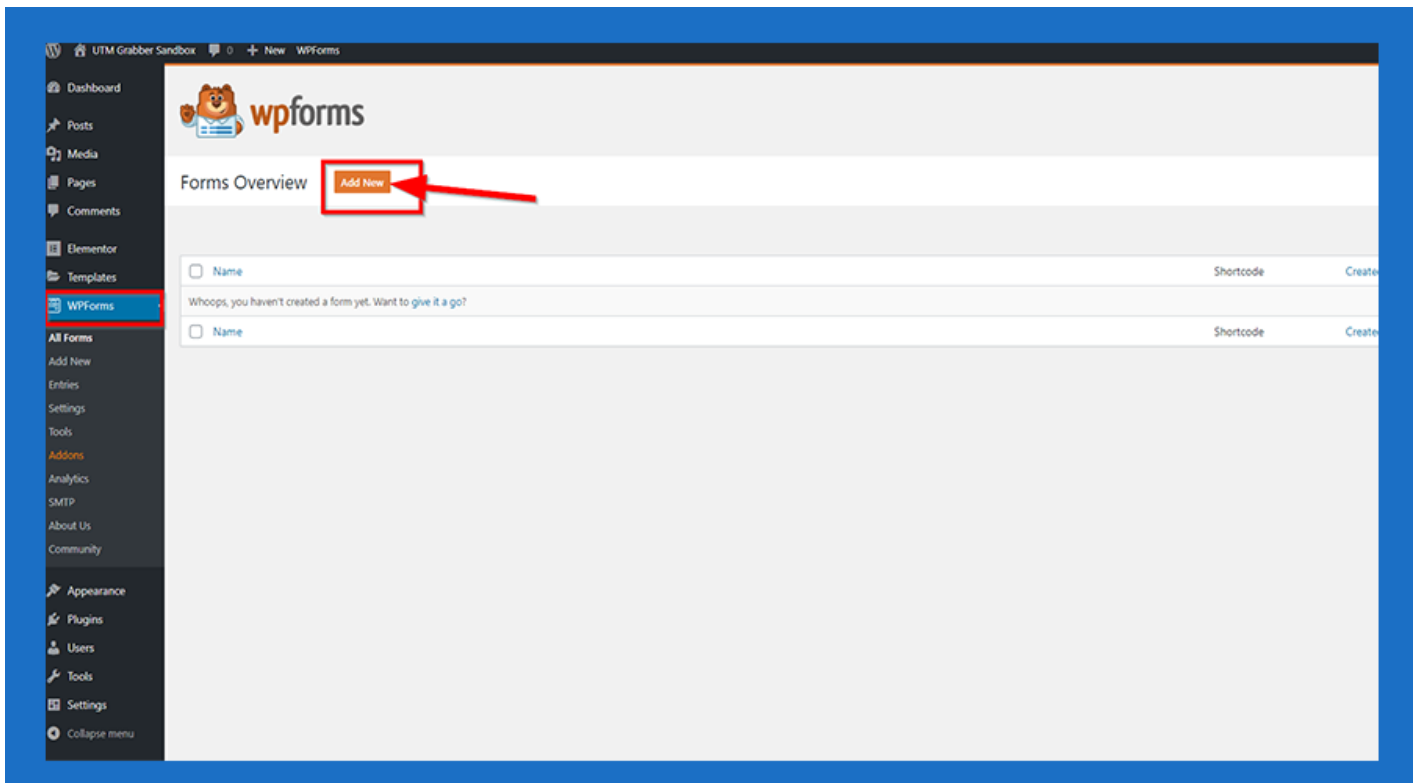

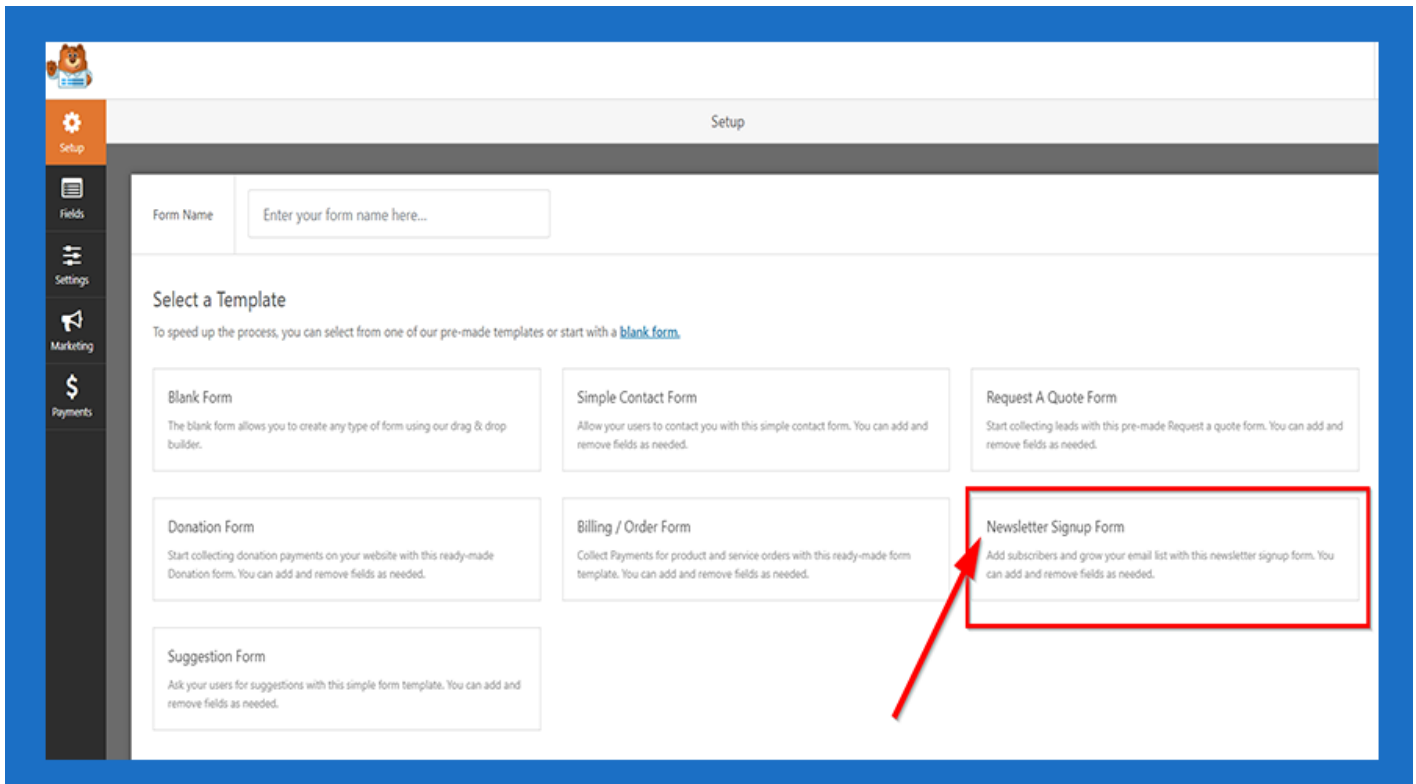

Wpforms Integration

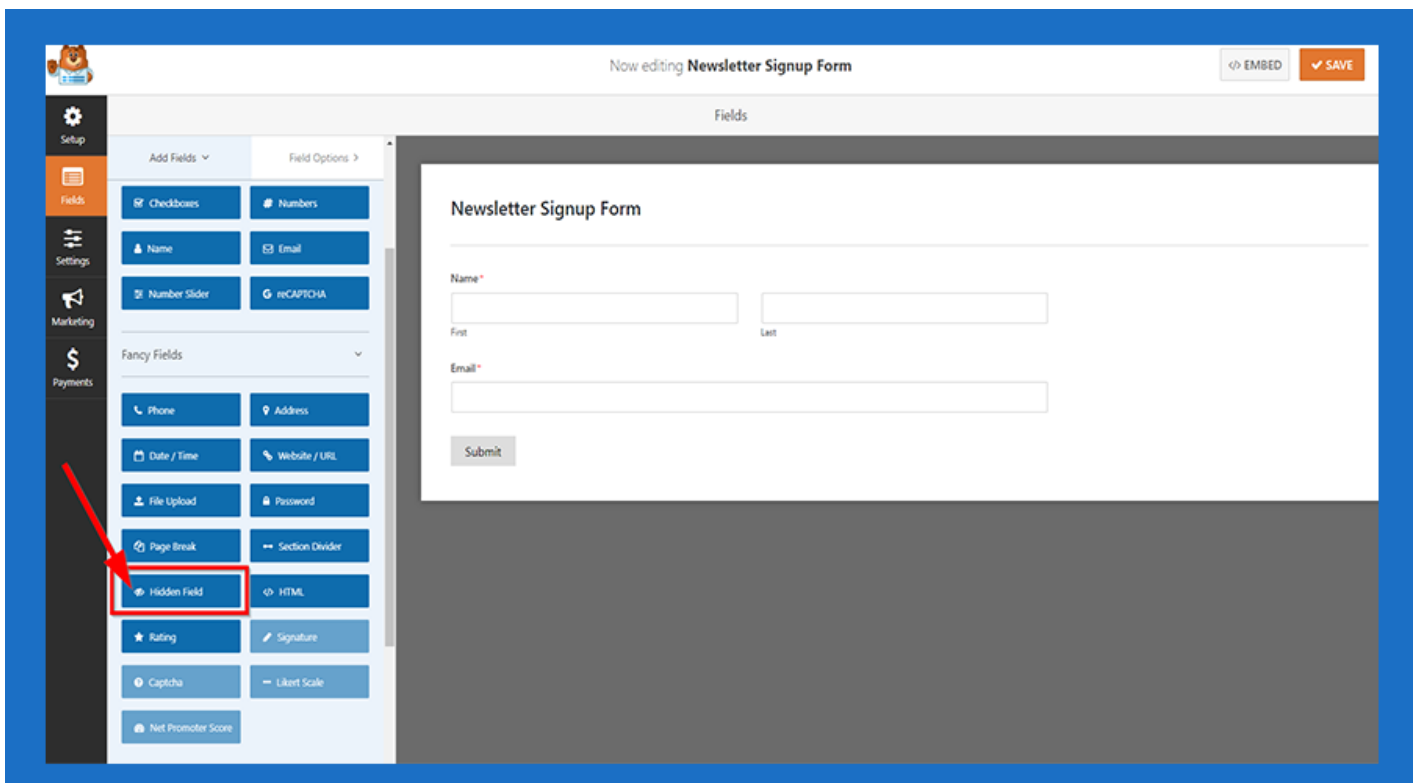
1. Select WPForms from the left manu and then click 'Add New'



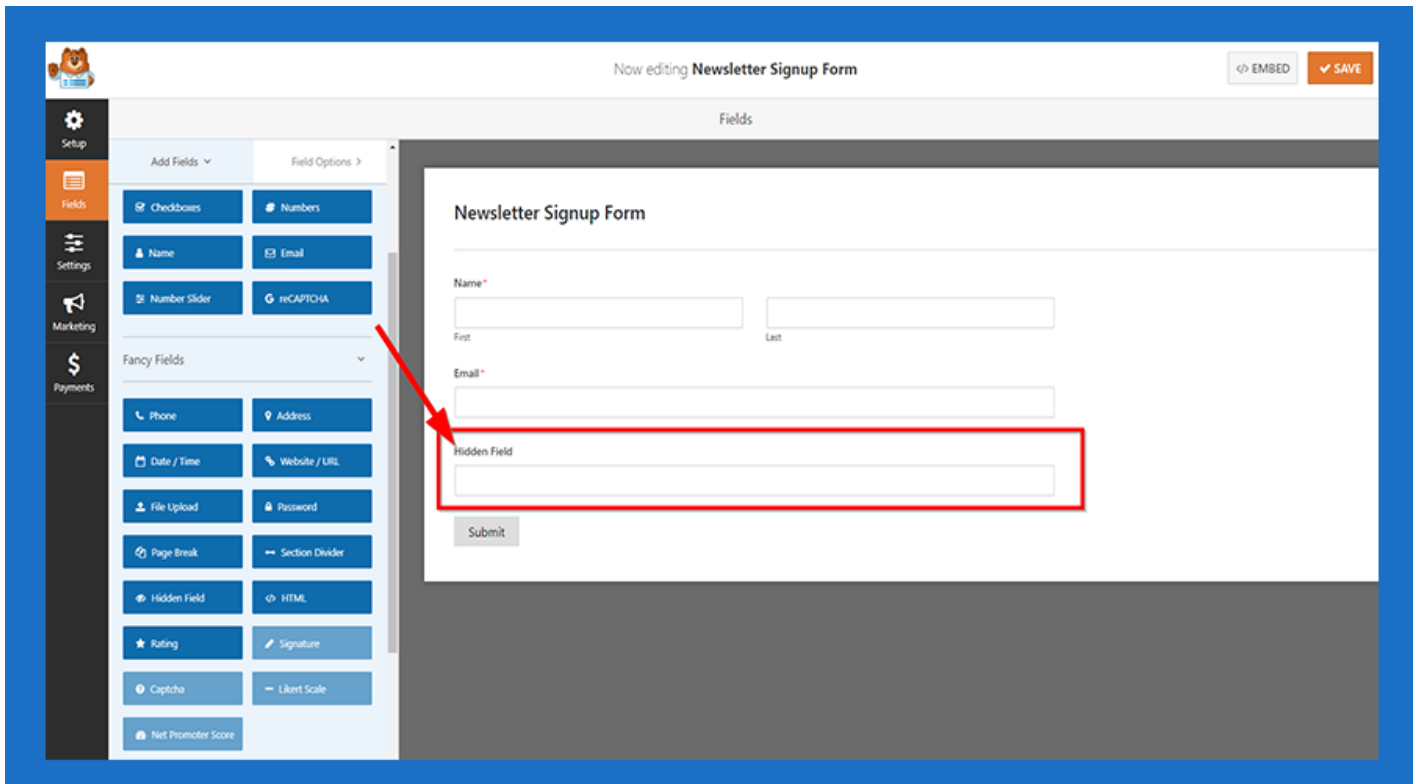
2. Click 'Newsletter Sign Up Form'



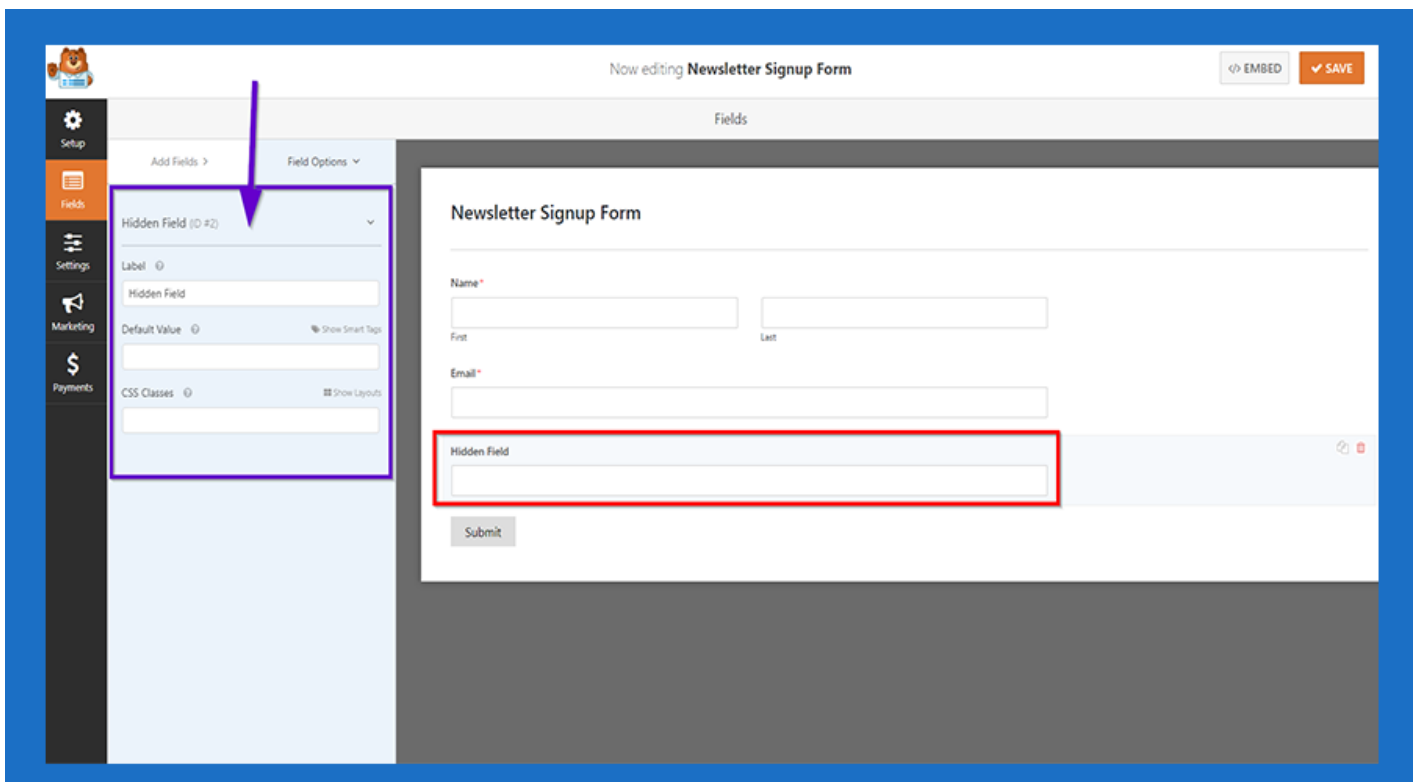
3. Click 'Hidden Field' Button

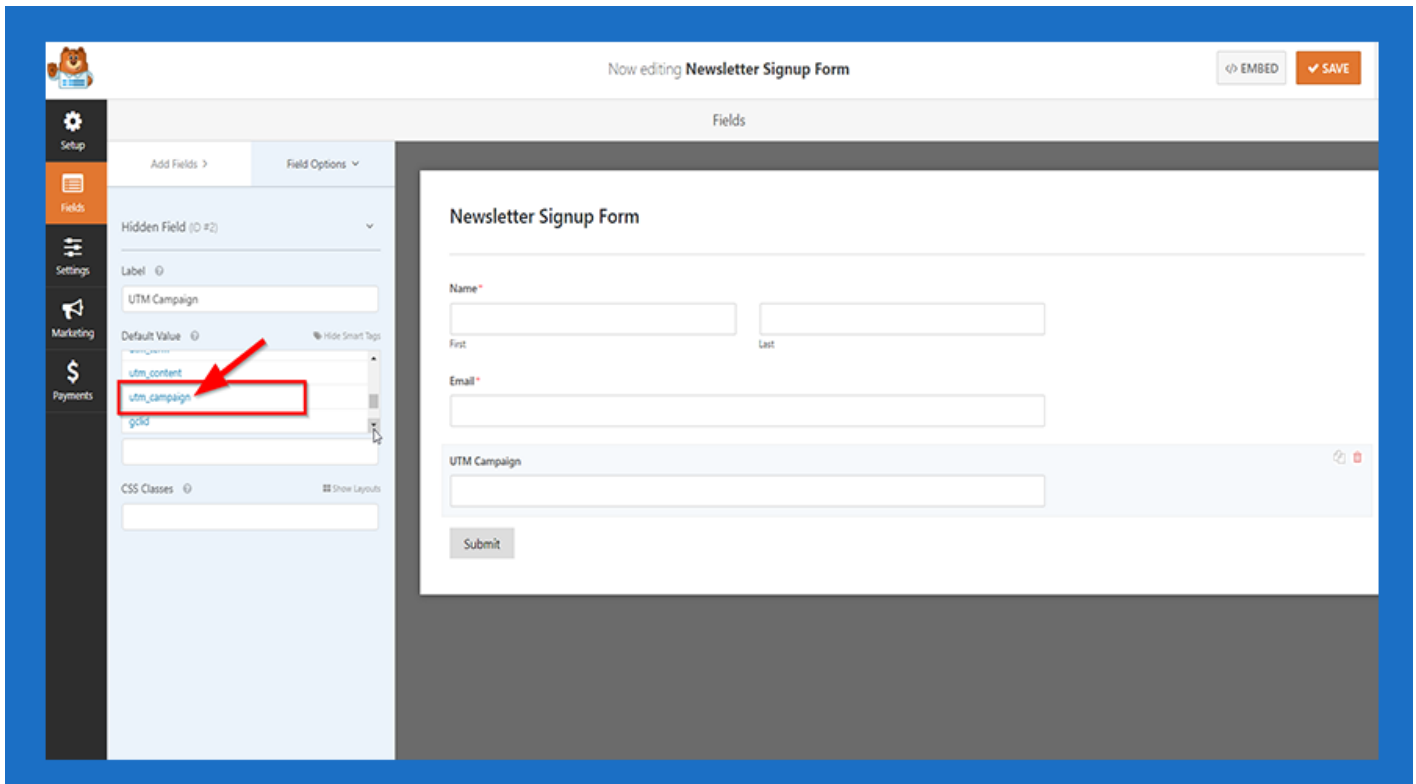

If you are adding `utm_campaign`, add the class variable as `utm_campaign` as well. This will enable client-side tracking to function properly, which is particularly helpful if caching is enabled on your site.



First add all the first attribution parameters as custom parameters
